### ***Mayor Carol Adams Corner***

Thank you once again for affording me the opportunity of providing Wandı residents with an update on City projects, our 2012 milestones and upcoming events. With the end of the year now upon us, it is a perfect opportunity to reflect on our past achievements.

On 28 November, the City held its annual Elector's General Meeting (EGM). During this meeting the 2011/12 Annual Report was received and is now available for viewing (visit [www.kwinana.wa.gov.au/publications](http://www.kwinana.wa.gov.au/publications) if you'd like some light bedtime reading☺).

The past financial year was certainly an historic one for Kwinana. We saw the opening of the Zone Youth Space, the introduction of the Sunset Fiesta Live! event, works progress at the Honeywood residential estate and the commencement of the new Kwinana Marketplace (formerly the Hub).

In more recent news, the Kwinana Marketplace Shopping Centre held its official stage one grand opening last month. The event saw thousands of local residents venture down to the new complex to celebrate this important community milestone. Once fully complete, our new primary shopping centre will boast double the retail floor space as the Hub. The Centre has already welcomed a range of exciting new retailers including Big W, The Reject Shop, Jeanswest and Betts for Her.

By now most residents should have received a community survey in the post regarding local government reform. This complex matter has now reached a point where we must consider the many options available, including voluntary amalgamation. The purpose of this survey is to better understand the views of Kwinana residents and your preferred governance structure moving forward. I implore you to read through this information carefully and provide your feedback to us; it is essential to our decision making process. If you have not received a copy of the survey, or have more than one person in your household who would like to participate, you can collect additional copies from the City of Kwinana Administration office, Kwinana Recquatic or Kwinana Library. The survey can also be completed online by visiting [www.kwinana.wa.gov.au/reformsurvey](http://www.kwinana.wa.gov.au/reformsurvey).

With summer now in full swing I am happy to report that the revamp of the popular Wells Park at Kwinana Beach has now been completed and opened to the public. The new park boasts a playground, change facility, BBQ area and the unique Mobi-Chair beach wheelchair.

The City is also putting our hand up to be the host of the inaugural Kwinana Community Christmas Appeal in conjunction with the Salvation Army and the Victory Life Centre. The appeal is for residents to donate any new or good condition pre-loved toys and long life food products from now up until Friday 21st December. Those items will be disbursed to

those in need up to the Christmas Holiday break. Collection points are the Kwinana Requatic Centre and Kwinana Library. Please check out our facebook page or call 94390200 for further details.

Finally, a short update on the proposed Wandi Hall which I know is of great interest to your community. A funding application has been made to Lotterywest for assistance with building the facility, however at the time of writing this piece, Lotterywest was still considering our application. We will be sure to update Wandi residents once we hear back.

In closing, I wish all Wandi residents a safe and enjoyable end to the year and a prosperous start to the next and look forward to updating you more in 2013.

## ***Wandi Memories***

\* Land was sold in Wandi in the early 1980's, the estate was called "Golden Grove" because of all the WA Christmas trees in the area. *Debbie.*

\* In the 1930's, Bob White and his siblings walked 2½ miles to school and back each day from their farm in Mandogalup. Sometimes they hitched a lift there on the milk truck." *Where it began" by Bob White.*

\* In the winter of 1936 Elsie (3) and Clem (5) Clementi became lost in the bush whilst picking wildflowers. The night was cold and wet and the children were eventually found fast asleep under a woolly bush by two aboriginal trackers. *"Where it began" by Bob White.*

\* In the early 1980's 5 acres of land in Wandi sold for about \$35,000.*Rod.*

\* In the late 1970's my uncle had 10 acres in Bodeman Road. He grew flower and vegetable seedlings. These were dug up carefully, wrapped in newspaper and sold in shops in Perth. *Edna.*

\* We went to school with the Treeby, Clementi, Fagg, Brook, Mclachlan, Norkett, Miles, Britton, Hill and Leslie children. We didn't wear shoes or boots to school. Lunch was simple sandwiches with egg, tomato, onion and beetroot. On the way home from school we would hitch a ride on the running board of Hansen's highly dangerous bakery van." *Where it began" by Bob White.*

\* During the war years potatoes were planted and harvested by hand. Three of us would deliver 12 tons in bags every week. *"Where it began" by Bob White.*

\* All the White children got married between 1953 and 1955 and built their own homes. Farm work started about 4.30am through until 6pm. Three times a week there was the market trip in the early hours. Houses were built in the evenings by Tilley lamp light. We started with one bedroom, kitchen, bathroom, laundry and outside toilet and extended the houses as the family grew. *"Where it began" by Bob White.*

## ***Those Pesky Millipedes – A Suggested Natural Control Method***

The following article comes from South Australia, however the Nematodes can be purchased for use in WA. Personally I intend to give them a go with the next major wave due with the first autumn rains. Working with your neighbours may be a good option as well since they will be attacked on many fronts. Whilst the cost is high just getting the rotten little critters under control may be worth it. Portuguese millipedes are pests throughout many areas of southern Australia. They are not poisonous but can be offensive in large numbers. Originally from Portugal, they were introduced to Australia via Pt. Lincoln - without any of their natural enemies.

Nematodes are tiny parasitic 'worms'. There are thousands of different types of nematodes – good and bad – and more than 20 years ago researchers in South Australia found the native nematode *Rhabditis necromena* attacks the introduced Portuguese Millipede. *Rhabditis* only attacks millipedes, and therefore will not affect other insects or plants.

How do the nematodes work?

The nematode is commonly found in southern Australia, but usually in low numbers which results in limited control of millipedes. Bug Central breeds the nematodes in specially designed facilities, and releasing them in large numbers helps reduce millipede invasions.

Millipede populations are controlled naturally by nematodes, but under these natural systems there can be a 10-15 year time lag between introduction of the millipedes and population decline due to nematodes. By introducing large numbers of nematodes, this time lag can be reduced to as little as 1-2 years.

Millipedes ingest the nematodes, which then kill the millipede by eating their way out through the gut wall - gruesome but effective! Nematodes reproduce in the dead millipedes, and then move back to the soil to start another infection cycle. This occurs best during autumn and early winter, even though this may not coincide with peak millipede invasions.

As this is a biological control, millipedes will never be eradicated but should be reduced to tolerable levels. Results over a number of years indicate that reduction has varied from a gentle decline through to a sudden crash in millipede numbers. Nematodes are not as effective when small numbers of millipedes are present.

Each order consists of 40 petri dishes infected with the nematodes, and is suitable for a large garden/small rural property. Cost is \$175 including GST and delivery to anywhere in Australia (excluding Tasmania, where quarantine restrictions stop us sending them). Once we receive your order, we will provide confirmation via email, and forward more information on millipede control.

Orders are sent via Star Track Express, so a physical daytime address is required where somebody can receive the order. Australia Post can be used where courier deliveries cannot be made, but an extra fee may apply.

Releasing the Nematodes

Detailed instructions on releasing the nematodes, plus information on other strategies you can use to reduce millipede numbers, are included with each order. It is important to note that prior to delivery you will need to collect at least 600 live millipedes to infect with the nematode

As a minimum to protect your home make sure you have a 20m circle of safety around your home and have your fire breaks constructed before 1st December. In a large fire there aren't enough trucks for one at every home, so please be prepared.

## **TOWN OF KWINANA FIRE BREAKS NOTICE 2012/2013**

### ***BUSH FIRES ACT 1954 (as amended)***

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the *Bushfires Act 1954 (as amended)* you are hereby required to comply with the requirements set out in this notice. The works outlined in the following as applicable must be completed before the 1st December 2012 and maintained until the 31st March 2013 inclusive.

#### **1. Area - 3001m<sup>2</sup> or greater**

Before the **1st December 2012 up to and including 31st March 2013**, you are required to;

1.1. Construct firebreaks not less than 3 metres wide immediately inside and along all boundaries of land including that land abutting road, rail and drain reserves and all public open space reserves, with all overhanging branches, trees, limbs etc to be trimmed back clear of the firebreak area, to a minimum height of 4 metres.

1.2. Remove all flammable matter except living trees, shrubs, plants under cultivation and lawns, of not less than 3 metres wide and minimum height of 4 metres immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land;

1.3. Firebreaks no less than 3 metres in width and minimum height of 4 metres are to be cleared immediately surrounding any place where wood or timber piles, hay stacks, tyres, vehicles, flammable liquids, chemicals and gas products are kept on the land.

1.4. It is recommended that where possible a 20 metre low ground fuel area is established around all habitable buildings.

Maintained living lawns are acceptable in conjunction with or in lieu of mineral earth firebreaks, provided that the same minimum width and height requirements for a firebreak are maintained.

In addition to the requirements above where the area of land exceeds 10 hectares, Council may require additional firebreaks of a minimum of 3 metres in width and minimum height of 4 metres to be installed and maintained to ensure that no area of land within the property boundary exceeds 10 hectares in area or where in the opinion that Council or its duly authorised officer determines it appropriate.

### **Vandalism at the Wandi Resource Centre**

In October hoons accessed the oval by driving behind the Equestrian Centre and entering through an unlocked gate. It was significantly damaged. Unlocked gates now reported to Council.

### ***City of Kwinana - Residents Concerns***

A number of concerns were received by the WPA, you may have the same thoughts or others – this section gives you an opportunity to pass them on to the rest of the Wandi Community.

**Roadside Verges** - I would like to know whose responsibility it is to keep the growth of Woolly-bushes, Banksias and other scrub down on the roadside verges. In our street, Stefanelli Close, the mowing is only done around shrubs and bushes which is quite understandable from the perspective of the operator of the mower, but not helpful in minimizing fire & smoke hazard. Over the years, the bush has regenerated with varying degrees of vigour on the street side of the fire-breaks in many parts of our suburb. I am also concerned as these overgrown sections have given cover to vehicles who park on the fire-break unseen from the road, and are able to be loaded with stolen goods. This happened to us over ten years ago, and I presume, is still happening from time to time. We were told at one time we could not cut down the undergrowth, but it is a huge concern in bushfire season. Woolly-bush creates a great deal of black smoke, and the fuel base that is building up this year is an accident waiting to happen.
