Mayor Carol Adams Corner

It is my pleasure to once again address the residents of Wandi and provide an update from the Town of Kwinana.

Livestock Management - I will start with an issue that is of particular importance to many Wandi residents; the environmental management of livestock (including, but not limited to, equine) on properties. In 2008 a working group was established to discuss this issue and develop better practices. The group included residents from Wandi, an environmental consultant and Town of Kwinana Councillors and staff. From this group, the Livestock Environmental Management Guidelines were formed; a document which aims to provide a mutually beneficial approach to what can often be a complicated issue. In early 2010, a draft of these guidelines was provided to the community for comment. Minimal feedback was received and Council subsequently endorsed the guidelines.

The Town of Kwinana Livestock Environmental Management Guidelines have since been implemented and are used by Council Environmental Health Officers and residents alike, to ensure standards are appropriately met. It is important to reiterate that the Town's Environmental Health Officers will not make decisions in regards to the health of livestock but rather they will investigate the area in which the animals are present and ensure environmental and public health standards are being met.

Preparing for the Fire Season

With the summer months now upon us it is very important that Wandi residents (in fact all community members) take the appropriate steps to prepare their homes and protect their families, from the threat of bushfires.

Firebreak notices were issued last month and compliance was due on **30 November**. Those who are yet to comply with their fire notices need to do so now as a priority, firstly to avoid penalties but more importantly to ensure the safety of their families and property.

Various Issues on Lyon Road

The Town has received complaints in relation to unlawful parking on Lyon Road, increased vehicle speed and litter that would seem to be coming from tradespersons who are involved in the construction of the display village at Honeywood Estate. The issue regarding the reduction of speed in Lyon Rd had been considered by Main Roads WA but it would seem they are reluctant to reduce the speed limit until the development has progressed further. This is of course of no immediate comfort to those living on Lyon Road. Council Rangers have been made aware of the parking issues and will attend if contacted, however their attendance, like most matters, will depend on availability and/or competing priorities. The builders have been advised by the Town about the littering issues.

The Year that Was

As the year draws to an end we reflect on the many accomplishments of the past 12 months, including the recent opening of the Zone, our \$7.5million, two-storey youth space on Gilmore Avenue. If you have wandered into the Town Centre recently you couldn't help but notice that the new Tavern is well on the way to completion (March 2012) and the Community Resource and Knowledge Centre is certainly taking shape.

The Town is hosting a community information night at the Council Chambers on Tuesday 6th December from 6 – 7.30pm where we will inform the community of the development currently underway, and what we have planned. Woolworths have agreed to attend and also expand on their development plans for the Hub Shopping Centre and the new Tavern owners will also provide a briefing on the development. We invite any interested residents to attend and find out more about what is going on in the Town. 2012 will again be a year of grand openings and celebrations and will cement Kwinana's position as Perth's most rapidly developing community. I invite you to join us in celebrating these achievements and sharing the excitement that is being felt throughout the entire Kwinana community.

In closing, on behalf of my fellow Councillors and the staff at the Town of Kwinana I wish you all a Merry Christmas and a prosperous start to the New Year.

Road Safety at the corner of Liddelow and Armadale Roads

The following report from the Banjup Residents Group is interesting, they are doing some really good work for their community. The Junction of Liddelow and Armadale road is very hazardous, especially when turning right. Sadly government funding for this junction may only arrive when it is too late. Personally I avoid the junction these days, taking the approach “taking 5 saves lives”....Ed.

Joe Francis, the local MP for Jandakot, arranged for members of the Banjup Residents Group to meet with the Main Roads Metropolitan Traffic Services Manager and the Policy Adviser to the Minister for Transport on site at the junction of Liddelow and Armadale Roads. The Traffic Manager was familiar with the junction and recognised that the risk of a serious accident had increased significantly since the junction was first built many years ago when Armadale Road was a 'rural' road. Now with 45,000 vehicles a day using the road (rising to 60,000 in a few years) the junction needs to be completely redesigned, as it will be when Armadale Road is duplicated. Sadly, budget has yet to be allocated for that project, so relief is at least 5 years away. Apparently, there is insufficient road width at the junction just to paint a turning 'pocket' at the junction. However, there may be some low cost options to widen the road a little. Main Roads and the Minister's office will liaise to see if anything can be done within the budgetary constraints. The Banjup Residents Group is hopeful that an interim, low cost solution can be devised that will soon make the junction much safer. We do not want someone seriously hurt before funds become available.

Alcoa Tailings Buffer Extended Causing Resident Concerns

KWINANA Council has asked the Department of Planning to meet with Mandogalup residents to discuss their health and amenity concerns over an extension of the buffer zone around Alcoa's tailings area. At the council meeting on October 12th council passed a motion to support rezoning of land, just outside the revised Kwinana Air Quality Buffer in the suburb, to 'urban zone' to allow for future residential and commercial development. Affected Mandogalup residents have raised concerns that the WA Planning Commission and Alcoa did not consult them over the extension of the buffer by about 1km to 1.5km late last year. Private properties and land owned by housing developers now falls into the buffer which opens a new "can of worms".

Wandi Landcare Updates

The Wandi Landcare group has moved into a period of calm where there is only the acquittal of funds to be done ie., the dreaded paper work. The only month of activity was October where Les Whiddet and I aided Julia Cullity from DEC to survey for Declared Rare Flora in the Wandi Nature Reserve and surrounds.

DRF Survey

On October 3rd and 4th, DEC held its yearly Declared Rare Flora survey at the Wandi Nature Reserve (WNR) and surrounds. The plan this year was to go over the areas previously surveyed to see if any new King Spider Orchid *Caladenia Huegleii* to add to the ever growing members of the family and then survey areas where they had been sighted before.

The late rains had allowed the orchids to flower earlier than they usually do and they had mostly well and truly bloomed at the time that time. It made the job very difficult but we persevered and found more new individuals to the number. No new populations were discovered in the WNR. The plan was to survey an area in the Oxford side of the Jandakot Regional Park (JRP), over the eastern side of the drain, where I had found some previously. We surveyed the area well but unfortunately came up empty. The following day we surveyed the JRP on the eastern side of De Haer Road opposite the WNR but came up empty there too. The only thing we did find was a fat tiger snake that sent Les Whiddet scurrying away in the opposite direction. I'm sure that if the conditions had been different and the orchids hadn't bloomed so early that we may have had more of a chance.

To round off 2011 I would like to thank all those members and non members that have helped out our activities throughout the year. Your hard work has been appreciated by the local animals and by the group. Thank you and we hope to see you again next year. May you all have a Merry Xmas and a happy and prosperous New Year.
