Department of Planning Amendment to Rezone Land at the corner of Rowley and Lyon Road for a Transit Oriented Development Precinct – Public Comment Submissions due by 16th July

The WAPC intends to amend the Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) for land in the local government of Kwinana and is seeking public comment. The amendment seeks to rezone approximately 6.8ha of portion of Lot 683 Lyon Road, Wandi from the rural-water protection zone to the urban zone. The report states that the purpose of this amendment 1186/41 is to rezone approximately 6.8 ha of portion of Lot 683 Lyon Road, Wandi from the rural-water protection zone to the urban zone in the Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) as shown in the map below. The amendment will facilitate a transit oriented development (TOD) which is in close proximity to the proposed Rowley Road (south) train station, following detailed local structure planning and subdivision approval.

The amendment is situated within 400-600m of the proposed Rowley Road (south) train station site. Urbanisation of the subject land is considered appropriate for the following reasons:

- The portion of Lot 683 the subject of this amendment is a contained and isolated parcel, bounded by Lyon Road and land currently allocated under the MRS, Jandakot Structure Plan and the draft Wandi (North) Local Structure Plan for future urban development.
- The site is wholly contained within 600m of the proposed Rowley Road (south) train station site. Development of the subject site supports the public infrastructure investment in the Perth to Mandurah rail line by increasing the future residential catchment of the proposed station precinct.
- The land forms a logical consolidation of the urban development front on the eastern side of the Kwinana Freeway. On this basis the amendment is considered a unique situation given it completes the finalisation of the urban zone within a TOD catchment on the eastern side of the Kwinana Freeway

The Department of Water (DoW) has no objection to the amendment if it is determined that the unique location of the site adjacent to the Rowley Road (south) train station and its associated high density TOD would provide a greater community outcome. In this regard, the DoW has advised that should the site be zoned urban, then they would reclassify the area from priority 2 to priority 3 to facilitate urban development accordingly.

Out of interest the report also states the proponent in consultation with the DoP and MRWA has undertaken a preliminary dual carriageway design and an environmental review of the proposed future alignment of Rowley Road. The review confirms that a dual carriage design can be wholly contained within the current MRWA reserves and does not extend to the amendment area.

Proposed Western Power Substation

Approximately 16 residents attended the meeting on the 23rd March. The following points were highlighted by western Power;

- This is a strategic land purchase and the substation is not likely to be required until beyond 2020, the timing is dependent on load growth.
- The location was chosen because it is central, has proximity to existing infrastructure/feeders and there is flexibility to install new feeders. Also the site can accommodate the standard substation design.
- ➤ The Wandi/Banjup area is currently supplied by Byford, Cockburn Cement and Medina substations. It is expected that in the future these substations will reach their maximum load capacity.
- The construction of a new substation at Wandi is required to provide sufficient capacity to meet the load growth in the area.
- ➤ The site is located 300 -500 metres from the Alinta Gas pipeline.
- Additional planting of native plants will be carried out to maximise screening.
- The house is currently tenanted and this status will remain until developed.

Many questions were asked which included;

- ➤ Had a load map been developed for the area?
- > Why was it that technical studies had not been completed before purchasing the land?
- > Can there be more information on the reasons why the alternate sites were discounted?

➤ Was Western Power aware of the Kwinana Council plans for the area, ie., no further development of Wandi for 20+ years?

The next steps by Western Power include:

- ➤ Network need investigation and information compilation Available online by around early May, for discussion at a third meeting tentatively scheduled for July/August 2010.
- ➤ Investigation of alternative sites suggested Western power advise that they are mindful that the community is keen for us to look into these sites to ensure the best land purchase has been made, and will undertake this work prior to the next meeting. They state that it should be noted that it is still their intention to retain the current site, unless they find an alternative site which provides a better overall solution, meeting Western Power's requirements.

Wandi Landcare Updates

Graceful Sun Moth Surveys at the Wandi Nature Reserve and Jandakot Regional Park - Over the month of March 2010, the Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) and the WLCG conducted a survey of the critically endangered Graceful Sun Moth (GSM) in the Wandi area. The graceful sun-moth (Synemon gratiosa) is a small, brightly coloured day flying moth found only on the Swan Coastal Plain. Monitoring the adult moth has presented a challenge, as it appears for only a few weeks each year, mainly in March, and has a limited distribution determined by the availability of suitable mat-rush habitat; Lomandra maritima and L. hermaphrodita of which L. hermaphrodita is found in the Wandi area. The adult moths emerge in late February and March. They have dark grey-black fore wings and bright orange hind wings and tend to hang around open areas like firebreaks. Over four surveys conducted three specimens were sighted of which one was trapped. There was previously only a single recording of the GSM in the Jandakot area some thirty years ago so this new finding in Wandi is very important. We walked a predetermined path through the Jandakot Regional Park (JRP) on four separate days and members of the WLCG participated to find the GSM. Thanks to all those that helped out.

Pigface Removal Days at the Wandi Nature Reserve - Two days were held over the month of May to attack the remaining infestations of pigface left over after the fantastic efforts volunteers put in over the latter part of 2009. On Saturday 1st May, a team of volunteers who had completed the herbicide course run by the WLCG, under the supervision of DEC, sprayed inaccessible infestations of pigface located deep within the WNR. These were deemed to be too far within the bush to be removed by hand and were sprayed with a broad spectrum herbicide avoiding adjacent natives where possible. We were successful in achieving our goals of spraying all the earmarked plants. Saturday 15th May was the pigface hand removal day, we had a great response and managed to remove nearly all of the remaining plants. We started out along the fence that runs along De Haer Road and ended out at the opposite firebreak.

Many large piles of pigface were created and it really did give a great feeling of satisfaction. A team from GreenCorp will go over the sprayed area and the remaining areas we couldn't finish on the 15th to complete the job.

I would like to thank all those that volunteered their time and effort towards the total removal of the pigface infestation in the WNR. *WELL DONE EVERYONE!*

WLCG and Baldavis Childrens Forrest Cooperate - The WLCG and the Baldivis Childrens Forrest (BCF) have joined forces to help each other and begin cross group cooperation which I hope will be the start of a new trend. The BCF have organised to have 30 year 6 students from Baldivis Primary School and 3 adults to come and spend some time planting at the Wandi Community Centre on the 22nd June 2010. In return the WLCG will supply BCF with nutrient caps so they may treat 60 Marri trees that are not in a good state of health. Angela Jakob will be on site as well as myself so if you would like to check out the action please drop by.

Herbicide Course Announcement - The WLCG has successfully received funding from International Power Mitsui to run workshops over the course of this year. The first will be a continuation of the Herbicide course and I am looking for people interested to participate. The courses are free of charge but membership to the WLCG is essential. Please contact me to secure your place in this workshop. The date of the workshop will decided when I have a full compliment of applicants. I will update everyone on the other courses later when I have more information.

Marquetry Club of WA

A new club had its inaugural meeting in the Shed at Wandi in May, their craft is Marquetry. Marquetry is the use of wood veneers to make designs, either geometric or pictorial to apply to any wooden surface whether boxes, furniture, coffins, picture frames or any item that you want to decorate with a design. A simple description is a Mosaic in wood veneer.

It is an ancient art going back to the Egyptians, who decorated their caskets, the Byzantine Empire and Gothic Monastery's who decorated Church furniture. The veneer is either cut by a knife or a fine blade in a fret saw, the pieces are then put in to a background veneer and the whole assembly applied to the item you want to decorate. The range of veneers is quite considerable, as are the colours and grain patterns.

This is the first club of its kind in WA and was attracted to the Wandi area because of the strong wood club emphasis that has developed here. They are meeting every Friday morning from 9.00am – 12.00 noon. The fee to attend is \$2.50 a head, this covers the room rent, tea/coffee along with a biscuit.

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

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


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
