## ***Good News for Wandj Residents – Western Power Substation – A Message from Western Power***

Dear Residents, Western Power would like to thank you for your involvement, input and patience regarding the Banjup/Wandi Strategic Land Purchase project over the past 2 years. In May 2009, Western Power purchased a parcel of land on the corner of Rowley and de Haer Roads in Wandj, for potential future use as a 132 kV substation site. Western Power undertakes these strategic purchases well in advance of a need for infrastructure, in order to make allowances for possible future infrastructure requirements. Because of the timeframes involved, these infrastructure requirements can and do change. As more work is undertaken to develop strategies for our network, we develop a higher level of certainty about what the requirements of our network and the community are.

In November 2010, we advised the Banjup/Wandi community that we were reviewing the vision and strategic development of our network (the South West Interconnected System) by developing a series of 10-year Network Development Plans. We do these reviews to ensure the network best meets the needs of the community and our customers into the future. These 10-year Network Development Plans, which have been drafted over the past 6 months, have been crucial in forming greater clarity over the suitability of the Wandj site for a future substation. The draft plans have revealed that, given our refreshed strategy, that the current site will no longer be used for the purposes of a zone substation.

After considering changes raised in the 10-year Network Development Plans, coupled with the latest forecasts indicating a new substation would not be required until after 2030, Western Power has decided not to proceed with a substation development on the site.

It is possible that a future substation site may be required to service the higher load growth areas to the north and west. The need for such a site will become clearer over the coming year and may trigger a separate site selection process, to ensure that Western Power is able to meet the power needs of the area.

The property is currently tenanted and Western Power will now determine the best way to sell the property. In the meantime, we will be removing the signage from the site, as it is no longer our intention to build a substation on it.

### ***Mayor Carol Adams Corner***

It gives me great pleasure to update the residents of Wandj through this excellent community newsletter, which in itself is a wonderful example of the community spirit present in the area. By the time you read this newsletter I would have attended the official launch of the Honeywood estate, a development which we have worked hard to progress while still trying as best as possible to retain the rural lifestyle and amenities which Wandj residents possess.

That being said, it is very timely that I address you on some of the other matters which have been affecting a lot of you recently.

**RRC Waste Facility** - Over the past few years we have been fighting to prevent the Rivers Regional Council (RRC), which consists of seven WA councils (Kwinana not being one of them), from establishing a waste facility on McLaughlan Road, Postans. Council had vigorously opposed the proposal which would have had adverse affects (noise and odour) on nearby residents and would have simply been a place for these seven councils to send their rubbish. We were particularly worried about the potential odours that would have affected residents east of the proposed plant in Anketell and Wandj as well as the massive increase in rubbish trucks using the Anketell Road exit of the Freeway.

The future of the proposal was in the hands of the State Government who owned the land (Water Corporation land) which the RRC wished to utilise for their new facility. I am delighted to announce that after a joint effort by Council, community groups, developers and other key stakeholders we have successfully lobbied in opposition of the RRC proposal and have now confirmed the State Government's support. The State Government has agreed to only release the land to the RRC if they receive support from the Town of Kwinana council.

The Town of Kwinana certainly does not support the proposal so residents can rest assured that the RRC will need to locate their new facility in a location outside of Kwinana (hopefully in one of their own local government areas).

There was certainly concern for those in Wandi so I hope this announcement comes as good news to a lot of you!

**Broadband in Kwinana** - It is our understanding that the provision of broadband is related to a household's proximity to Kwinana's only internet exchange located in Medina and the available 'connections' at any given time. Broadband services are administered by the Federal government so as a local council we are limited in what we can do to help residents obtain better internet connections. Our primary role lies with lobbying the Federal Government to grant more attention to the Kwinana area.

A couple of months ago I led the South West Group (SWG), which represent Mayors and CEO's from the City of Fremantle, East Fremantle, Melville, Cockburn, Kwinana and Rockingham on a trip to Canberra. Broadband was a major issue which was discussed and more specifically how the National Broadband Network (NBN) would be rolled out in Perth's South West Corridor (including Kwinana). Following this we have informed the NBN Company of the immediate need for better broadband services in the south-west portion of the Perth metro area and Chris Fitzhardinge (Director of the South West Group) is continuing to lobby on our behalf.

I myself live in Wellard where decent broadband connections are far and few between so I very much share the frustration of my fellow residents and would like to mention that this issue is mirrored throughout many regions of Western Australia and is an issue which many local governments are trying to get pushed up the list. The Federal Government does seem to be proactively seeking long term solutions for broadband connectivity but we are looking for them to provide more immediate solutions and will keep the community updated as the issue progresses.

**Winter Preparation** - Finally, with winter already upon us, I encourage all residents to ensure their properties are well prepared for storms and strong winds.

### ***Wandi Scamwatch***

**Microsoft Scam** - WA Consumer Protection has had calls from hundreds of people in WA who've been phoned by scammers posing as Microsoft engineers. The bogus operators, believed to be based in an Indian call centre, claim to be able to perform maintenance on computers remotely. In reality they want to charge you for an unnecessary service, a desktop clean-up you could do yourself for free, or to remove unwanted software which they install while accessing your PC. Dozens and dozens of Western Australians have put themselves at risk of identity theft by giving the cold-callers their IP address and enabling remote access. (IP stands for Internet Protocol in case you don't know and it's the numerical label assigned to your computer). Others have been asked to log onto a website which allows the caller to link up to their computer. Whatever way they get access, the scammers can alter security or anti-virus settings. They

can also add a key-stroke recorder which registers personal or secure details, during online banking or internet trading for example, and then in turn those details could be used fraudulently.

Watch out also for a pop-up falsely claiming to be from Microsoft – it installs unwanted software. You may then be asked for payment to remove that software. Many people have paid by credit card for non-existent system upgrades or upgrades that are available for free online. Refusal to pay may be met with threats to change your passwords or lock you out of your computer. The amounts charged vary greatly but figures are between \$125 and \$385. Thankfully “victims” have been able to get the money back from their credit card provider through a transaction reversal. However this leaves credit card details in the hands of an unknown third party.

It’s important to note that Microsoft will never cold-call a customer and request access to their computer and Microsoft do not direct third parties to do this for them either. If you receive an uninvited phone approach to help fix supposed computer errors or technical problems do not give out your IP address; in fact we recommend you just hang-up. The best advice is to;

- (1) Never let unknown third parties access your computer
- (2) Regularly scan PCs with an up to date virus detection program
- (3) Do not be fooled by legitimate sounding organisation names like “Windows Security” or “Windows Service Centre”
- (4) If you have allowed a Microsoft scammer to access your computer you should consider having it inspected by a reputable technician to ensure it can no longer be logged onto remotely and is free from malicious software.

### ***Have you had Problems Recently with your Telstra Landline?***

A local resident has asked if the WPA could determine if other Wandi residents have had problems with outages in their Telstra telephone service recently. His phone line has been out of use on at least eight occasions this year with six failures in April. He felt that Telstra was not responding to his complaint and had lodged an official complaint with the Telephone Ombudsman. ### ***Broadband in Kwinana and Wandi***

The Kwinana Courier reported that Mayor Carol Adams says the town should be short-listed for the rollout of the National Broadband Network (NBN), with many residents still struggling to connect to broadband. Tell us about it here in Wandi, many of us have no access to basic ASDL and instead have to rely on slow dial up or expensive wireless connections. The NBN may be coming but it is quite likely that as usual we will be at the bottom of the pile for the service. Out of interest Vivid Wireless now seems to have good coverage of the Wandi area and being 4G claims to provide much faster speeds.

### ***Kwinana Council takes the first step for Rezoning in Casuarina***

At the ToK meeting on 27th April the proposal to request the Western Australian Planning Commission to transfer land within the Casuarina Cell from the Urban Deferred to Urban was approved by council. The proposed urban deferred lifting has been prepared for the Casuarina Cell, comprising 54 landholdings with an approximate land area of 277 hectares. The Cell is bound by Thomas Road to the north, Water Protection Zone and Bush Forever Site 273 to the east, Mortimer Road to the south, and the Kwinana Freeway to the west. The Casuarina locality is predominantly utilised for rural residential and agricultural purposes.

### ***Please Consider your Neighbours when having Parties***

A local resident has expressed concern to the WPA in regards to lack of consideration by some residents when having parties. We all know that here in Wandi because of our special rural location noise can travel considerable distances at night. Therefore if you are having a party please consider others and turn the volume down after midnight. Under the Environmental Protection Act unreasonable levels of noise can be an offence and lead to prosecution.

### ***Banjup Residents Group Formed***

In February 2011, over 80 residents of Banjup established the Banjup Residents Group. The Group is pursuing several issues that directly affect the Banjup community, some of which impact on us here in Wandi including:

- Monitoring the security implications of the Banjup children's home

- Determining the reality of Jandakot Water Mound
- Improving road safety

### ***Clean Up Australia Day***

A big “thank you” to the twenty-one volunteers who helped with the annual Clean Up Australia Day on 6<sup>th</sup> March. In a two hour period we collected 53 bags of rubbish. We picked up from various roadsides in Wandi. The litter predominantly consisted of glass bottles (mainly alcohol), plastic bottles, drink cans, tetra drink packs, fast food containers, cigarette packets and over-the-counter pain relief tablet packets. In addition we found tyres, broken bicycles, fire extinguishers, large cardboard boxes together with dumped building materials.

Roger Cook, Member for Kwinana, assisted in the rubbish collection and stayed around for coffee and a chat when we had finished. The WPA is grateful to the Satterley Property Group who sponsored Mr Mocha (a mobile coffee van) to provide drinks, muffins and biscuits for the hungry group.

Littering seems to be an increasing problem in all areas and we encourage local residents pick up rubbish if out walking in the area. The WPA will continue to work year round in the Adopt-a-Spot area around the Community Centre and on the traffic island on De Haer Road.

### ***Dwellingup Forest Heritage Centre, School of Wood Closes***

Sadly the rather unique Forest Heritage Centre, School of Wood at Dwellingup closed their doors last week through lack of government funding. If you have ever done any courses with them, then you will know what a huge loss this will be for the wood working community. 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## ***Wandi Landcare***

### ***Wandi Community Planting Day***

The Wandi Community Planting Day was held on Saturday 14th May 2011. The site of the planting was adjacent to the Magenup Riding Club, the same location as last year. There was a great turnout which was encouraging considering that the previous planting didn't go so well due to environmental factors. The date was brought forward this year to try and avoid the heavy frosts that caused problems last year. The soil was unfortunately very dry due to the lack of rain this and last year but luckily the following week was wet. With some ongoing rain, the seedlings will be better established to survive the oncoming frosts that will surely arrive. Let's keep our fingers crossed. In total, 700 seedlings were planted. It was unfortunate that the dusty conditions caused everyone some discomfort and this will be taken into consideration in future plantings. I apologise to all those that were afflicted.

After the planting everyone enjoyed a tasty sausage or two and a freshly brewed coffee and muffin at the Shed. It was the perfect finish to a constructive morning.

I would like to thank everyone that sacrificed their Saturday morning to make the planting a great success; to thank Rod and Debbie Cocks for their tasty sausage sizzle, Satterleys for supplying the Coffee van for the event and finally to thank the office of Roger Cook MLA for printing out the flyers.

### ***Pigface Survey 2011 in the Wandi Nature Reserve***

Follow up surveys were conducted over the month of April to see if any of the infestations of pigface that were removed last year had re-established. A skeleton team of Janet Carr, Les Whiddet, Julia Cullity from Urban Nature and myself was organised to mark areas needing work and to remove any small growths. We were all pleased to see that re infestation had not occurred and the thorough work carried out in 2010 left us to find very little pigface plants over the entire nature reserve. Time permitting a survey should be carried out after the winter / spring rains to see what sort of seed germination occurs especially in areas where large individuals were removed. All in all it looks very promising. On going Perennial Veld grass spraying will continue again this year as well as a DRF survey in Spring.

*Julia Cullity from DEC adds;* "After the concerted efforts in 2009/2010 of removing 340 mature pigface plants (*Carprobrotus edulis*) Wandi Landcare combed over Wandi Nature Reserve on two mornings in April this year and removed a total of only 28 small plants in our follow-up weeding. I would like to congratulate the group and thank all involved for their efforts in restoring the banksia woodland of Wandi Nature Reserve. It came as a surprise that the task of managing pigface at the reserve could be so successful in such a short period of time - eighteen months. A job well done! Future focus on the reserve will be the continued weed management of perennial veld grass (*Ehrharta calycina*) and freesia (*Freesia alba x leichtinii*) and spring monitoring of the rare and threatened grand spider orchids."

### ***Woody Weeds Removal at Jandakot Region Park***

Robert Campbell (Jandakot Regional Park Officer), Julia Cullity and I had a site meeting to discuss the management of weeds on the eastern side of the drain adjoining the Magenup Lake area. The Wandi Landcare Group had received funding from the DEC Community Grants of \$5000.00 for weed control but due to the extensive drought, little weed

growth was observed. We decided to take a drive further east towards the pristine areas of bushland and discovered a large infestation of woody weeds (*Acacia longifolia* or Sydney Golden Wattle) that were encroaching on the bushland. The direction of the project was changed and the woody weeds have been earmarked for hand removal later this year.

### ***Seed-savers Club***

Do you grow your own plants or vegetables? Do you also enjoy collecting the seed from your produce for future sowings? I am looking for interest in starting a seed-savers club in the local area. The idea is to have a network of enthusiasts who save their own seed so we may exchange seed to help keep the varieties strong. Seed from locally grown plants and vegetables slowly adapt themselves to the poor soil that has been dealt to us and grow better.

### ***Land for Wildlife Project***

What is Land for Wildlife ? - Land for Wildlife is a voluntary scheme that aims to encourage and assist private landholders in Western Australia to provide habitats for wildlife on their property, even though the property may be managed primarily for other purposes. If you wish to protect or create wildlife habitats on your property, the Land for Wildlife scheme can offer advice and assistance - whether you manage a farm, a bush block, a Shire reserve or a roadside. Participation in the scheme is entirely voluntary. Registering with Land for Wildlife will not change the legal status of the property in any way – (from the DEC website)

#### **General**

- Hoon Behaviour and speeding continues – The Banjup Residents Group has been lobbying traffic police to increase the frequency of setting speed traps along Liddelow Road. A few months ago a speed camera was in place between 5 am and 9 am one weekday morning. 400 vehicles passed it and 92 were subsequently issued speeding infringement notices. Most speeders were travelling over 100 kph; one was clocked at 145 kph. That is, 23% of drivers going to work that morning along Liddelow Road were exceeding the speed limit by a substantial margin. On 19<sup>th</sup> May one driver was clocked at 183 kph!  
To report dangerous, reckless or anti-social driving (hoon) behaviour Call police as soon as you can on **131 444** and advise if you believe the behaviour will continue long enough for police to attend the scene.
