Mayor visits Wandi for Wandi Progress Association AGM

Kwinana Mayor Carol Adams visited Wandi to be the keynote speaker at our AGM. Approximately 40 people attended. Carol did an excellent job and spent an hour letting us all know about Town of Kwinana plans for Wandi and Kwinana. Key points were as follows;

Community Infrastructure Survey – The community infrastructure survey sent out in December last year was sent to 850 residents, from this 161 residents responded (a 19% response rate). Out of all the suburbs Wandi had the largest response rate at 44% of all respondents. This reflected the strong community in this area. The results were; of the 161 responses, 5% commented that they did not want community infrastructure as they had chosen to live in a semi rural area. Only 4 responses received were identifiable as from community groups currently using the facilities already in place. For both the 1st and 2nd preferences 50% of responses were for footpath/cycle paths. There is also a strong demand for bus services, post boxes and retail facilities within the zone. The feedback from the survey regarding Wandi Community Facilities was; (1) The facility is OK as is (2) A new boxing/sporting facility is supported (3) Why Wandi and not Casuarina (4) Extra and improved parking facilities (5) New Play Equipment, BBQ's and Picnic facilities (5) Lighting for tennis courts (6) Skate Park (7) Toilets not to be kept locked / more toilets. The usage statistics of the Wandi hall, Clubrooms and shed were highlighted.

Town of Kwinana Support for Wandi Boxing/Sporting Facility and Footpaths

The Mayor announced support for Boxing/Sporting Facility with \$100,000 being put into the 2011 – 2012 budget proposals. Footpaths would also be going into budget priorities.

Town of Kwinana “Dropped the Ball” in regards to Wandi

Mayor Adams admitted that the TOK had “dropped the ball” in understanding the sentiment in the Wandi community that we were dissatisfied with services and facilities, however this was now being addressed and council were much more aware of community requirements especially after speaking with committee delegates last year, which was the catalyst for the community/rural survey.

Town of Kwinana General Information

Mayor Adams gave a description of the massive \$340 Million Town Centre project which will provide a substantial enhancement of shopping, retail and office facilities, and will create a modern, attractive and vibrant focus for the community. It includes;

Education - The development of a new \$22 million knowledge centre and community resource centre will strongly enhance the educational opportunities in our Town. This will be a leading edge facility comprising library, community meeting and non government office spaces, and life long learning programs, all designed to provide the highest level of services and opportunities to our community. Also included are a new \$45 Million High school and an Automotive Centre of Excellence (TAFE).

Retail - A planned 50% expansion of retail floor space at Kwinana Hub Shopping Centre, along with \$40 million of improvements. The expansion will include a 250 seat alfresco style food hall, a Woolworths and Big W around the same size as Gateways, a revamped Coles and specialty stores.

Civic - The civic area of the town centre will become a focal point with the recent announcement of the development of a new alfresco tavern and licensed restaurant, new offices and commercial space, landscaped walkways, and a prominent town square.

Youth – A new \$7.5 Million Youth Centre is under construction and the Town was hoping it would be ready for completion towards the end of this year.

Residential - Town of Kwinana approval has recently been granted for a medium density residential development within the Kwinana town centre. The Council is working with leading developers and a formal announcement detailing this project is anticipated shortly.

Nature Walks – The 21km Kwinana Loop Trail is due to be completed in 2012, giving residents the opportunity to see their town from a different perspective.

Council Concerns – Mayor Adams highlighted to the meeting that the Rivers Regional Council (comprising of 7 local governments) has made a decision to build a Resource Recovery Centre on the Water corporation site at McLaughlan Road in Kwinana. The TOK is totally opposed to this development as well as the River's second preferred site in Millar Road as Kwinana residents **including Wandi** could be affected by smell and truck moments. The water corporation agreed with the TOK that the site would not be leased for a RRF without council concurrence. Mayor Adams is of the view that the RRC are making efforts to bypass the TOK by lobbying government departments. The TOK continues to lobby extensively against this development, contacting property developers who may be impacted

such as Satterley and Peet Limited, the Minister of Water and State Government. They may be looking for community involvement in the future if the council looks like being overruled.

Questions – questions were asked on;

Rural Ward representation – No change likely to the present representation rules.

Local Elections – Mayor Adams and WPA encourages local representation on council, the next elections are due sometime in October.

Further Development in Wandí – Planning commission has a policy called 2031, the Mayor is not aware of any other developments planned for any further development East of Lyon Road.

Dual Carriageway Anketell / Rowley road – These roads are primary regional roads required for the new Fremantle Port – WPA note - There is definite planning for a dual carriageway for Rowley Road West between Rockingham road and Kwinana Freeway. There is a comprehensive report on this at

http://www.fremantleports.com.au/MediaPublications/3Transport_corridors_alignment_options_review.pdf. This report details that it is expected that the Rowley road extension would carry between 12,000 and 25,000 vehicles a day by 2021. The road east of the freeway is designated as a “Primary regional road reserve”, this means a major road, however no plans can be found on this after an Internet Search. Therefore Rowley Road residents need to conduct their own search via main roads, <http://www.mainroads.wa.gov.au/AboutMainRoads/Pages/FAQs.aspx#property>

Mandogalup Railway Station – There is no time at present for the development of the station. It really depends on population density. Mayor Adams is very wary about residential development east of the Freeway because she does not wish to leave a long term legacy in regards to the potential impact of the Alcoa mud lakes. It may be that this area may be zoned industrial in the future.

The Wandí Progress Association thanks the Mayor for giving us such a comprehensive report and hopes that she will return next year as it is a super way of interfacing with the Wandí community.

Green Waste Collection Dates – The ToK made an error on the published dates in the Community Calendar, the correct dates for Wandí are 28 March and 27th June.

Banjup likely to Change Zoning from Rural (Water Protection) to Urban – Need Wandí Residents be Concerned? - Yes we should ...and it's all down to “Directions 2031”!

It seems Jandakot MLA Joe Francis is pushing for rural landholders to be able to take advantage of zoning changes in Banjup. He said there had been a great deal of commercial and urban development in Cockburn over the past few years, but private landowners trying to subdivide smaller rural and semi-rural blocks were finding it difficult to capitalise on their investment. Cockburn City Council has proposed changes to the zoning of areas in Banjup from Rural (Water Protection) to Urban. This will give greater scope in allowing the land to be developed for residential purposes. Mr Francis has stated that there was a growing “appetite” for property subdivision in Cockburn and many small landowners have been finding it hard to subdivide their properties. Whilst this is not Wandí, where we keep hearing that nothing is going to happen until 2031, the release of the state government's future planning framework, “Directions 2031 and beyond” back in August last year, will effectively rule where higher density housing will be focused in Perth and Peel, even without council approval. Kept that pretty low profile didn't they??? Planning Minister John Day announced back then that the framework, combined with new powers granted to government, will allow for 47 per cent of additional housing over the next 20 years to be urban infill and consolidation projects. Hence the State Government framework is targeting a population growth of 566,000 people, requiring 328,000 new homes to be built with about half being within a 20 kilometre radius of Perth's CBD. The legislation which has gone through Parliament gives the state, through the planning commission and the Department of Planning and the minister, the ability to act to require local governments to put in place the planning arrangements over and above local governments where that's appropriate to do so. Whilst Wandí is 25km from Perth we must continue to be vigilant (we

gather Rockingham has been included) against State Governments which are all about development at all costs and do not really care about the unique environment that pockets of remnant bushland like Wandi contain.

Stalwart Committee Member John Lydon Retires from Wandi Progress Association

Retiring committee person John Lydon leaves the Wandi Progress Association after many years of service to our local area. John has been a valued member of the committee from 1994-1997 and was Vice President 1997. After a short break he rejoined in 2001, was Vice President 2002-2005 and a committee member 2005 -2010. As a long time resident of Kwinana and Wandi, John has spent most of his life helping the wider community, either through church activities, as a qualified electrician or as a citizen of Kwinana. His electrical knowledge was invaluable in the WPA early formation as we ran a yearly fair, which very quickly became popular. We needed a reliable power supply. With Johns help a power system was installed with multi sub boards around the fair area. These are still used today by our caravan groups. Electrical conduit was placed below tennis courts for future lighting, flood lighting and entry lighting was also performed, as well as the power supply to the classrooms and Shed which was moved from Hope Valley. With the help of his tractor, clean up of the area around the oval and hall site was achieved as well as placement of barriers to prevent cars getting on to oval. John also helped with planting and other jobs as a Land Care member, helping with work on the equestrian centre when it was built, being a labourer on the many busy bees, including the many kilometres of fencing installed.

I really cannot put to paper all that John Lyndon has achieved in this community, but I would like to recognise him personally as a true gentleman, who often has put others before himself and has personally helped me over the years. A very special thought also goes to Edna, his wife.

Wandi Landcare AGM Report 2011

It has been quiet on the landcare scene over this summer but we have a busy year ahead of us later on this year. The WPA AGM was held on the 16th February and I delivered a summarised yearly report. For the benefit of those that didn't attend I have included it here;

Projects undertaken by the WLCG in 2010

Planting Day with the Baldivis Children's Forest;

30 year 6 students from the Baldivis Primary School and Chaperones, the WLCG & the T of K cooperated and planted 400 native seedlings at the Magenup Lake. A great time was had by all.

Community Planting Day at the Magenup Lake over two days;

We had a great turnout even though the weather was cold. Unfortunately the plants were affected by the severe frosts that followed.

Surveyed for rare and endangered Grand Spider Orchid;

Members of the WLCG and DEC surveyed the Wandi Nature Reserve and discovered a previously unknown population of the Grand Spider Orchid *Caladenia huegelii*.

Surveyed for rare and endangered Graceful Sun Moth;

Surveys were also carried out with DEC to find the Graceful Sun Moth *Synemon gratiosa*. Pre determined walks over the Wandi Nature Reserve and across De Haer road were undertaken and three specimens, one of which was trapped were discovered.

Pig face weed infestation removed from the Wandi Nature Reserve;

Volunteers from the WLCG and members of DEC walked over the entire Wandi Nature Reserve and manually removed 95% of all the pigface plants over several outings.

Arum Lily control over the drain at Magenup Lake;

The WLCG and DEC cooperated to spray the eastern portion of the drain that is under DEC's control. This work complemented the Arum Lily control program implemented by the T of K.

Perennial Veldt Grass control at the Wandii Nature Reserve;

Grants were applied for and funding received to spray the entire WNR for Perennial Veldt Grass. The end result was patchy but still worth the effort. This spray was done in July 2010.

The Wandii Landcare Group thanks everyone who gave some their time to help on these projects. You can join the WLCG by completing the WPA application form at the end of this edition of the Warbler.

Projects for 2011

Sun Moth and DRF Orchid Surveys at the Wandii Nature Reserve;

More surveys at the WNR for the Graceful Sun Moth will be carried out by the WLCG and DEC again this year over the month of March 2011. We meet at the southern reserve entrance off De Haer road at 10am. The proposed dates are:

**Friday 4th March, Friday 11th March 2011,
Monday 21st March, Monday 28th March 2011,
Thursday 31st March 2011.**

The walk is a pleasant 4km walking over the firebreaks. Please bring appropriate clothing, a hat and water etc. The weather is usually warm at this time of year so be prepared.

Orchid surveys will be carried out on **Monday October 10th & Tuesday October 11th 2011**. We meet at the same gate entrance. More information will be forthcoming.

Pigface revisit days;

We plan to walk over previously weeded pigface sites to check for re-infestation and clear as necessary. The dates for this activity are as follows;

Saturday 16th April and Monday 27th April. This is a worthwhile cause and any time you have spare to participate would be welcome.

Community Planting Days at Magenup Lake;

The T of K and the WLCG have decided to bring forward the Community Planting Days due to the frosts that were sustained over June – July 2011 period. The main planting day will be held on Saturday **14th May 2011** and the ancillary day Monday **6th June 2011**. The venue is the same as last year at the entrance to the Magenup Lake accessible via the Magenup Equestrian Centre. We will commence at 9:00am and finish at 12:00pm. A tasty sausage sizzle will be presented by Rod and Debbie Cocks at the Resource Centre BBQ. I look forward to seeing you there.

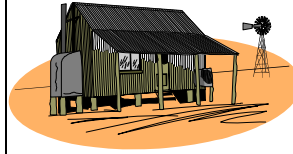
