Here are some photos of pieces that have been completed ready for the finish. Don't let them discourage you. They are a couple of the best






WOOD CARVING-A JOURNEY (3)

SOME WORDS OF WISDOM


I have often wondered what qualities are required to get to the top, and perhaps different ones to stay there.
