"On the Beat" with Mike Newman, OIC, Mundijong Police

Hello to all our ewatchers,

The past month has seen 141 reported incidents with local police attending to 356 tasking matters. These figures are comparable with the last few months.

There has been a rise in reported burglaries with the "hot spots" being Byford (21), Wandi (10) and Oldbury (7). Byford and Wandi have had display homes targeted where the "crooks" are taking televisions, stove tops and hot water systems. Of concern to me, when reading incident reports, is the number of homes that are entered by crooks through unlocked doors or windows. I am not trying to bore everyone with the same message but these offenders are not going to let an easy opportunity go begging. For those living in the more rural areas, simply closing your gate when you leave the property, may be a simple deterrent to prevent you from becoming a victim. A vehicle was reported abandoned by a community member on the on Mundijong Road in a rest stop a couple of weeks ago and within 3 days every window had been smashed and all the wheels had been stolen with the vehicle being left on wooden blocks. There are plenty of unsavoury characters prowling around and given the opportunity they won't think twice about stealing property.

Our local policing team were supported by the Traffic Enforcement Group (TEG) two weeks ago which saw four motor bikes and two unmarked vehicles conducting patrols within our sub district. They spent some time around the Orton Road area looking for speeding trucks. Several drivers were issued with infringement notices as well as 10 work orders, hopefully this may cause drivers to improve and modify their behaviour.

Local police have also been targeting the Byford area where numerous complaints have been received regarding hoon drivers. On the 30th July Police were conducting discreet enquiries in the area when they observed the driver of a BMW depositing some rubber on Tourmaline Blvd. near the roundabout. Needless to say a 25 year old male has been charged with Reckless Driving and had his car impounded for a month. Costly exercise for a moment of stupidity.

This is my last ewatch report for a while as I am going away on annual leave. Sergeant Bron Umbras will be sitting in my chair, so feel free to contact him if you have any issues. If you haven't visited the WA Police online site

UV Marker Pens

If there is one way of making sure someone knows that something belongs to you, it's putting your name on it.

Why not take that one step further in your home?

Only a small percentage of stolen property is returned to its rightful owners. In most cases hundreds of thousands of dollars' worth of property remains in the hands of the Police after being recovered, simply because it cannot be properly identified.



The Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale is offering a free UV marking Pen to all ewatch members. Pens are available from the Mundijong library or the Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale office at 6 Paterson Street, Mundijong. Ultra Violet (UV) markers are invisible to the naked eye but the Police can check recovered property for UV marking with a UV lamp.

Marking your property is a simple way to assist in identifying and recovering stolen property. Australian Police recommend that valuables be marked with your WA driver's licence number i.e. WA2255769.



A property register form is available to download from the WA Police Community Safety website http://communitysafety.police.wa.gov.au/images/resources/P98774_-

_Homeowners.pdf, this list should be kept in a safe place and copies sent to your insurance company. Where you mark your property is also important. For quick and simple identification it is best to mark your property in the top right hand corner or the back or underneath the item. For larger items such as TV's and stereo's mark it near the items serial number. Take a good look around every room in your home as well as your garage or shed. Consider all
