**2. WELCOME** The President opened the meeting at 7.40pm and welcomed guests.

## 3. CONTRIBUTIONS OF RESIDENTS/GUESTS

Shahan advised

Happy to provide flyers and coffee van for tree planting day.

Nothing commercial approved at this stage in Honeywood.

Display villages have a 2 year life span, looking at another site on the estate soon.

Her budget for events has been reduced but will include a movie and a musical evening.

R Cocks moved that the minutes of the meeting held on 17 April 2013 be accepted. Seconded by W Tentori. Passed.

The man allegedly involved in film making who wanted to access the Centre's power supply has somewhat reluctantly moved from the area. RC had confirmed that the man had not been given permission by CoK to be on site.

## 7.2 TREASURER

PH tabled the report as at 30 April 2013:

The six month term deposit (currently \$51,955.45) matures 16 May 2013 and will be re-invested by PH for six more months at 4% interest.

The ATO refunded \$884.00 for GST – paid on the new roof earlier this year.

W Tentori moved that the Treasurer's report be accepted, that the term deposit be reinvested and that accounts be paid. Seconded by R Pattinson. Passed.

#### 7.3 FACILITIES

DC spoke about the busy month and gave the Treasurer \$1349.50 being hall hiring fees collected. As this weekend is not too busy, LW is planning to install the cupboard and oven into the kitchen. Security not working properly – PH to investigate.

Light globes gradually being replaced.

Urn faulty. RC gave details on replacement.

R Cocks moved that a new 20L urn be purchased on-line to the value of \$300 and up to \$100 be allowed for the repair of the old urn, PH to investigate. Seconded by P Hegarty. Passed.

The half yearly inspection of the fire extinguishers will take place next Monday. Performed by HECS and arranged and paid for by City of Kwinana.

LW will have the keys for the buildings etc over the June long weekend as RC/DC away.

#### 7.4 PROJECTS

The acquittal for the CoK grant for the kitchen cupboard and electrical work to be prepared for Council.

City of Kwinana have requested a meeting with RC to discuss the fit out of the new building.

New rainwater tank (25,000L) delivered. Old one disconnected and capped. Site needs to be extended and levelled prior to installation of tank. RP to contact CoK re obtaining material for the base. RP and PH offered to assist LW with this project.

R Pattinson moved that up to \$150 be allocated for the purchase of material (metal fines) to be placed under the tank (if not available free from CoK). Seconded by P Hegarty. Passed.

# 7.6 LANDCARE

Shahan advised that she had been approached by a couple of Honeywood residents who are keen environmentalists and interested in organising a "Friends of Honeywood" group. She will ask them to contact JC with a view to inviting them to the next WPA committee meeting and maybe becoming involved in the Landcare group.

## 7.7 WEBSITE

WT reported that progress is slow. He suggests it should be changed to an Australian host when current one expires. He will probably need to re-write the whole website as it is currently in an old format. To be reviewed next month. Advise WT of any corrections needed on current website.
