7. REPORTS

7.1 PRESIDENT

Concerned about recent break-ins locally. Residents should be vigilant and report any suspicious activity or vehicles to police.

RP suggested approaching Fremantle Ports for funding for 25th Anniversary celebrations.

7.2 TREASURER

Due to the Treasurer's absence from the meeting, his emailed report was tabled. As at 30 April 2012

The term deposit matured on 16 May 2012 and has been re-invested at 5.3% maturing on 16 October 2012

Invoice sent to Ocean Broadband for 2 years rent (\$2000).

PH's reported on Western Power's estimate for power extension to building is \$19,353.00. As this is 30% greater than their initial estimate, we are entitled to cancel the job and receive a refund of the design fee (\$1500 less GST). RC to discuss action with PH.

Money paid in from rent etc \$2797 (year to date \$9245 approx).

L Whiddett moved that the treasurer's report be accepted and the invoices paid. Seconded by W Tentori. Passed.

7.3 FACILITIES

DC reported on bookings for June.

Hinges on meeting room door replaced. All locks graphited and hinges reset on Club room doors. Continuing problems with security lights with RC reporting that the control board is difficult to programme. A suggestion was made to have a PE cell installed instead. RC to follow up with Council. Tennis court locks and key lanyards are ready for change over.

7.4 PROJECTS

RC and LW together with representatives from Town of Kwinana met with Lotterywest re funding for Shed extension. Lotterywest require more money to be allocated from Council funds or an additional grant to be obtained. "In kind" donations from WPA such as site works were discussed. There was a long discussion on increasing WPA allotted contribution (currently \$15,000) and requesting pledges from the various clubs eg woodturners, Smithy

LWhiddett proposed that the WPA commit a further \$25,000 to support the proposed new building bringing our total monetary pledge to \$40,000. Seconded by W Tentori. Passed.

RC to write to each Club asking them for a pledge and what aspect it is for – eg building, working environment, labour etc.

RP to contact Eclipse to obtain a quote for site clearing and levelling.

All these details are to be included in a letter to Council advising them of our increased contribution. RC noted that there was an element of urgency as the Council are currently doing their budget.

7.5 SOCIAL

It was reported that the Anketell Group's Biggest Morning Tea raised \$676.20 for the Cancer Council.

25th Anniversary – Sunday 28th October 2012

Notes from the subcommittee meeting were distributed prior to this meeting. A further subcommittee meeting will be held on Wednesday 23^{rd} May.

JC moved that the WPA allocate a budget of \$1000 for the celebration. Seconded by D Cocks. Passed. (It was noted that if funds were forthcoming from other sources then this money would not be required.).

7.6 LANDCARE

7.6.1 Community tree planting

WT is looking after Landcare during FE's absence. Angela Jakob is aware. The community planting is to be held on Sunday 20 May starting at 9am. ToK have provided \$150 for the BBQ which RC/DC will arrange. The coffee van has been booked by Satterleys. JC to bring a Lions cake.

LW will be available to coordinate the two additional weekday plantings.

7.6.2 Restoration of bushland

JC advised that she had attended a DEC meeting regarding restoration work being undertaken to offset the clearing of vegetation at Jandakot Airport. where 17 hectare of bushland has been identified as being dieback and relatively weed-free. The land has been cleared and the topsoil is being moved to three sites, the principal being Anketell/Thomas Road (12 hectare site). Direct seeding and planting of seedlings is being undertaken plus germination from seeds in the topsoil is being monitored. It is hoped to increase the available Banksia Woodland area for habitat for the Carnaby Cockatoos.

DEC and WWF have launched a community survey to locate populations of bandicoots in the greater Perth Region. Further information on www.wwf.org.au JC to forward information to JR for Warbler.
