The playground equipment that was donated to the WPA by the Satterley Property Group earlier this year has now been installed close to our existing children's playground, between the tennis courts and the club rooms. A huge thank you goes to committee members Chris Barnes, Les & Marilyn Whiddett, Rod & Debbie Cocks and Ken Workman who gave up part or the whole day to install the equipment. There were a few aching bodies at the end of the day, but it was a very satisfying outcome.

Thanks to Satterley for donating the equipment and also a big thank you to Bendigo Bank Kwinana for the \$500 donation towards the installation. The site works, bobcat clearing, limestone laying and supply and delivery of the white sand, was done by A Class Earth Moving Pty Ltd. Thanks to Doogsy and his team at A Class for their excellent work on this project. All up, the cost of installing the equipment was in the vicinity of \$10,000 of WPA

Due to the number of groups now using the facilities, it has been necessary to purchase some additional tables. We acknowledge the kind donation of three trestle tables by Bunnings at Cockburn South Central.

We are looking to fill the Landcare co-ordinator position as soon as we can. It's a very fulfilling and satisfying role with a lot of potential. WANDI LANDCARE GROUP

As our previous co-ordinator has moved away from Wandi, we need a new leader for this group. Landcare is a sub-group of the WPA. Whilst a portion of the budget comes from annual membership fees, the majority comes from small grants. The Landcare Group has an excellent working relationship with the City of Kwinana's Bush Care Officer.

The annual tree planting days around Lake Magenup damplands, held during the winter months, are the principle focus of the Landcare Group. In fact WPA members were planting trees long before there were any buildings on the current site.

Our previous co-ordinators have been local residents with an enthusiasm for caring for the environment. Over many years, as well as the tree planting, events have been arranged when required with the assistance of Greening Australia, Dept of Conservation, Greenskills

BUSHFIRE PREPAREDNESS

Over the long weekend residents in the Scovell Crescent area of Anketell (or Wandi Heights as it was known when the area was first subdivided) were visited by Fire Brigade members who assessed residents' preparedness in case of a bushfire threat. It was fantastic to be given specific advice on what we can do to improve our efforts to save our own properties in the event of a fire. A big thank you to all the volunteers who gave up their Sunday morning. Just keeping our fingers crossed we won't need to see our roads full of fire trucks this summer.

HONEYWOOD PRIMARY SCHOOL

Three names were gathered from the community and submitted in order of preference based on votes, to the Minister for Education. He endorsed the community's first choice, Honeywood Primary School. The Steering Committee and I are however, very mindful on ensuring that **Wandi** is acknowledged in the school somehow. This may be in the naming of a building or in some other way, which the committee will discuss at the next meeting.

SCHOOL SITE Stage One – Kindergarten and Pre Primary There is much earthmoving at present and retaining walls are being constructed to level the site and provide a foundation for the transportable classrooms. Once the transportables have been delivered and services attached, work on shade structures, verandas, paths and play areas will commence. Stage one will be fully fenced with access and car parking provided on Honeywood Avenue.

ENROLMENTS We already have 77 enrolments.

OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE (OSH) the Family Tree in Aubin Grove will provide an Out of School Hours Care service for our school starting in 2017. Vacation Care will also be provided on site.

OPEN DAY The school will have an Open Day on 22 January 2017 from 3pm – 6pm. This will give families the opportunity to come into the school, collect booklists, uniforms, view class lists and tour the school. There will also be a sausage sizzle and a Westbooks Pop Up Book Store where you can purchase a book to donate to our library. 
