Mayor's Message

Welcome to the Spring edition of the Wandi Warbler. The weather is warming up and the wildflowers are in full bloom, a great time to visit the Kwinana Wildflower Reserve. A lot has been happening lately in Kwinana we have a lot to celebrate as we head into the summer season.

With recent elections over I am thrilled to be re-elected to the City of Kwinana for a 5th term. I'm looking forward to working with the new council as we welcome two new councillors, Merv Kearney and Matthew Rowse and congratulate Sandra Lee who was re-elected to Council and Peter Feasey as he was re-elected as Deputy Mayor.

The City's Adventure Park has now won five major awards! The City received three major awards at the Parks and Leisure Australia (WA) Awards of Excellence 2017. These awards recognise the highest calibre parks and playgrounds across the state. The Kwinana Adventure Park was named; 2017 Community Program of the Year, 2017 Playspace of the Year (over \$500k) and 2017 Park of the Year.

The Act-Belong-Commit Rock Symphony will feature everyone's favourite rock and pop legends like never experienced before, performed by the fully-fledged, 55-piece Perth Symphony Orchestra.

The orchestra will rock Calista Oval as they perform hits from Metallica, Led Zeppelin, Nirvana, Pharrell Williams and Adele plus film classics from Pirates of the Caribbean, James Bond, Lion King and more. The Wandi Progress Association were given \$5000 to complete a community project and decided to hold a first aid course run by St John Ambulance. Community Event: St John Ambulance Community First Aid course

Saturday 15th October at the Wandi community centre

In October we held our St John's ambulance community first aid course for the wider Anketell district at the Wandi Community centre. We had in excess of 50 residents and friends of the district plus a number of volunteers attend the community training day which was an excellent response. The event became possible after a grant application was submitted by the Wandi Progress Association Inc for \$5K made available by the City of Kwinana for a suitable community project.

Jenny Royle (Place Management Co-ordinator with City of Kwinana) attended our May meeting of the Wandi Progress Association Inc (Held on 3rd Wednesday of every month at the community centre) and provided a presentation on local funding available. Feedback provided previously to the City of Kwinana from local residents in the Anketell district identified that residents were seeking for funding to be made available to improve two key areas being, education and safety in our community. The community grant application was then submitted and in June the funding was approved and made available for the Anketell district project. The district includes the wider areas of residents from Mandogalup, Anketell, Wandi Rural and Wandi residential.

St John's Ambulance (Corporate) were then approached for a suitable date in October, being Saturday 15th, and in addition as a community co-ordinated event kindly discounted their normal fee for the 6-hour course to enable additional residents to attend.





Community Event:

We advertised by placing promotional flyers on our Wandi Progress Association (Inc) website page, included an article in our Winter Warbler edition then sent it out in our distribution list and updated our Facebook site.

We then also approached other local community based groups in the Anketell district to promote the event and the response from residents was overwhelming and before long we had our minimum numbers.

As with all community events there is a lot of co-ordination behind the scenes but with the assistance of our amazing WPA Inc committee members and friends/family from the district the various jobs were allocated.

On the day we started bright and early at 8.15am for an 8.30am start and had three St John's ambulance facilitators in attendance who co-ordinated the training schedule for the Community first aid program.

Everyone was welcomed and it was clear the need of the first aid training was very evident from the outset. Many attending had never had any first aid training whilst a number were seeking for a refresher course and it was great to see our community coming together and sharing their knowledge and experiences.

There was a wide range of people attending including local residents and friends covering our youth/ young families/middle age and seniors through to carers and anyone else in between who were just interested in being able to help others and themselves in times of need

The St John's ambulance facilitators were excellent and managed to keep the group going through the various sessions and covered a wide range of first aid topics.

Community Event:

Some of the topics included were Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for adults, children and infants. We also went through the DRSABCD Action plan being Danger, Response, Send someone for help Call 000, Airway, Breathing, CPR & Defibrillation. There was then plenty of opportunity to practice the theory provided and the groups went through various exercises to demonstrate the learnings. The course had an easy and informative pace with a break for morning tea (Tea/Coffee and Muffins/Cookies) and then a light lunch (Rolls) before finishing up around 3.30pm. The day was really well worth the investment in yourself and feedback from those attending found it very informative and helpful. The training skills and techniques provided were pitched at a community level to build your confidence so that you can provide some basic first aid skills where and when needed. The aim then is that hopefully this will then assist with basic skills and awareness our families, our friends, our neighbours and anyone else in the local and wider communities.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone who supported the community project including our sponsor the City of Kwinana and St John's ambulance staff but also all the volunteers that assisted with a lot of co-ordination leading up to the event and on the day

For those of you that attended from the Anketell district please let the City of Kwinana know of your feedback and if you can think of any other community based training suggestions you might have for them to consider in the future

Knowledge is Power and First aid knowledge is very powerful in our communities to help others in times of need.





How Has Wandi Changed?



I moved to Perth in 2012 to take up a job opportunity after a backpacking holiday around South America. The desire to have a slice of the suburban good life coupled with the hunt for affordable land led me to Wandi - a place most people in Perth have still never heard of! I built in Honeywood and moved in to my new home in early 2013. I kept a fairly low profile in the

community until 2014 when a call went out for residents to form a local community group in the estate. I decided to offer my expertise as an accountant and put my hand up for the role of Treasurer. At this point I had never really ventured east of Lyon Road preferring to stick to the suburban streets I knew. A fellow committee member mentioned that the Wandi Progress Association was also looking for a Treasurer and with a little arm twisting (and numerous explanations of how to get to the Wandi Hall!!) convinced me to come along to a meeting. At this point I quickly realised that there was a lot more to Wandi than just the little piece I had been driving around and a lot of great people who were passionate about the community and ensuring there were facilities available to all residents.

Fast forward a few months and the President of the WPA Wayne suggested to me I may like to join the local volunteer bush fire brigade. This led to a fair amount of head scratching as I wondered what skills a desk jockey such as myself could offer. However eventually my curiosity got the better of me and I agreed to head down to the Mandogalup brigade one evening to find out a bit more. Walking from the carpark to the station I was fairly nervous to say the least and had to keep reminding myself that I didn't have to join if I didn't want to. It turned out all my nerves were uncalled for as I walked in and was

introduced to a friendly bunch who were very welcoming. I've been in the brigade for 18 months now and although the learning curves have been (and continues to be) steep with plenty of new skills to learn it is a very rewarding past-time. Aside from responding to emergency call outs we also conduct controlled burns in the area (in the picture I am torching Wayne and Debbie's block),

community events such as Neighbour Day at the Wandi Hall and the annual Christmas lolly run on Christmas morning.

Watch out for us this year from 7:30am around the streets of Wandi Anketell and Mandogalup to see Santa and get some lollies.

Since I moved to the area the size of Honeywood has more than tripled. When I arrived the only way in and out was Morwell Entrance, Lyon Road ran straight through from Rowley to Anketell and the primary school didn't exist. It's amazing how much has changed in just a few short years. It's great to see as we have grown that there is still a real sense of community and despite the urging of many of my friends to move closer to the city I can honestly say there is nowhere else I would rather live. I think my enjoyment of living here has definitely been enhanced by all the fantastic people I have met in the community and I would encourage everyone to explore the area (as it turns out the Wandi Hall is really just 3 minutes down the road!), check out all of the great facilities on offer and join a local community group.

In September the Wandi Woodturners hosted the WA Woodturners Assoc. AGM with around 120 in attendance. The day wasn't all business with talks on design, advanced turning construction and demonstrations. The WA Woodturners Assoc. has also made Wandi its new home and they have plans to develop their state wide organisation further using Wandi as its base.

The Carvers Guild hosted a pyrography (wood burning) workshop in October for members, this focused on techniques that would enhance their carving by adding texture and patterns. Well known national woodturner/pyrographer Doug Bell from South Australia was in the West working with Collaboration WA and was the Master Craftsman instructing at the workshop.

We have two caravan clubs staying over before Xmas and a couple of weddings as well as the usual birthday celebrations from 1-80 years young.

Exterior painting on the verandas woodwork at the Clubrooms and Hall has just been completed and doors and frames will start in 2018. A security system upgrade has also been completed for the Hall, Clubrooms and Pavilion. The WPA has undertaken these tasks as part of our management agreement with the City of Kwinana; further work will be started in 2018.

After the vandalism to the oval a few months ago the City of Kwinana has now top dressed the grass and its looking pretty good and once the hot weather arrives the kikuyu will grow through giving us a good surface again.

A few weeks ago, I was lucky to find a discarded syringe under the paper bark trees near the Hall carpark, it was disposed of carefully. If you use the Community Centre watch out for these objects as I know others have helped out by carefully disposing of this type of thing in the past. We sometime think we are in the bush but where there are places for people to have privacy close to amenities there is an attraction for this type of behaviour. Just be careful if you have kids wandering around. Just to add to this the City of Kwinana regularly has staff inspecting the sand in the playground and it's mechanically sieved a few times a year.




