I could not go to the recent Banjup fire but I kept an eye on it as we all did that day. It was a stone's throw away from us and luckily it didn't come our way. Thanks to the valiant efforts by all those concerned no houses were lost. I am more than happy to speak to anyone about volunteering as a fire fighter. It is such a rewarding venture.

I've been with the Education Department for 14 years working full time as a Database Administrator. I sit behind a desk all day long and look forward to coming home and doing some physical work around the property or just getting into the shed and doing some woodwork. I am a member of the Wandi Woodturners and a couple of other woodworking groups. It's great that we have such a diverse range of woodworking clubs at Wandi. If woodworking sparks an interest in you, don't hesitate to check out what Wandi can offer.

Well, that's probably enough about me. Wandi has such a lot to offer its residents - friendship, community spirit and great surroundings. ## **RESIGNATION**

Rod Pattinson has resigned as Vice President & Committee member. Rod has been a committee member for many years and held the position of President on six occasions. He was also a Councillor for the Town of Kwinana representing the rural ward during the early 2000's. The WPA awarded Rod a certificate of community appreciation for his work done as rural ward Councillor with the Town of Kwinana at the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations in October 2012.

## **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

The AGM of the WPA was held on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> February. The number of residents attending was disappointing especially as Wandi's population has been increasing recently. The 2014 committee was elected but there are no new faces this year however we are delighted that Honeywood residents Catherine and Henry remain committed to Wandi Landcare and keeping us up-to-date on the website/Facebook etc.. Brief reports were presented by committee members then Mayor Carol Adams, our guest speaker, brought everyone up to date on the proposed Council amalgamations. Councillors Wendy Cooper and Sandra Lee and a number of officers from the City of Kwinana were in attendance and a question & answer session followed covering various issues raised by residents (see responses in Mayor's Message below).



## **MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

Thank you once again for allowing me the opportunity to bring the Wandi Progress Association and its residents up to date with a few issues and concerns raised at its AGM in February. - **Overgrown verges causing a fire hazard, a place where people dump rubbish and causing restricted vision for drivers. Also lots of weeds (pigface) on verges.**

Due to the prevalence of native flora, the majority of Wandi has been declared an Environmentally Sensitive Area by the Minister for Environment which means that verges can consist of native vegetation.

The City undertakes pruning of these areas when required and we also investigate and mitigate any fire hazard.

The City looks at both private and public properties to ascertain where fire risks exist including road reserves, natural areas and weed infested properties.

Unfortunately dumping is prevalent across the City regardless of verge treatment. The City targets these areas with covert surveillance and issues infringements to offenders if apprehended.

The City encourages residents to report any concerns in relation to fire hazards and illegal dumping, with officers more than happy to investigate.

Veldtgrass has been identified on verges within Wandi. The City will continue to monitor verges and investigate programs to assist with weed control.

- **Overhanging tree on Wandi Drive.**

Upon inspection, Officers could not identify a tree of concern overhanging on Wandi Drive.

- **Lack of footpath along Lyon Road north of Honeywood estate, problem for cyclists and pedestrians going to Rowley Road for bus and schools.**

A Dual Use Path will be extended from Honeywood up to Rowley Road. This is being done in conjunction with the upgrade to Lyon Road.

There are multiple stages to this project and while the dual use path is currently at stage 6, the actual road upgrade has not progressed past stage 1 due to other infrastructure developments planned for the area that would require the removal and re-installation of road networks and footpaths. What we don't want to do is prematurely spend money installing the new footpaths, only to have to rip them up a few months later.

This dual use path will extend through three more stages, all the way up to Rowley Road, once the other infrastructure is completed. At present, it is anticipated these works will commence towards the end of 2014.

- **10m vegetation buffer in front of the display homes (Honeywood) facing Lyon Road not being maintained.**

Upon inspection of properties facing Lyon Road, it is evident that two homes of the estate are not complying with the vegetation buffer requirements; trimming the front vegetation instead of allowing them to screen the home, and not replacing plants that have died.

Letters will be sent out to property owners in the vicinity of Lyon Road reminding them of their obligations in relation to the Detailed Area Plans.

Our building project is still in the mix; the City of Kwinana is making progress and is on the edge of an expected successful funding application with Lotterywest. The power supply to the site is being upgraded, this includes the main line in and transformer, the cable has already been installed under the road so eventually the overhead wire will be removed.

Our successful grant application to C of K has realised the installation of a reverse cycle air conditioner in the Club Rooms - the main room where the majority of small groups meet. Whilst it came a little late to cool us this summer, users will be kept warm in these coming winter months.

The halls car park lighting will be upgraded allowing it to stay on all night, we hope this will help with security and give those using the facilities at night a better sense of safety.

## WANDI LANDCARE GROUP UPDATE

The Great Cocky Count occurred on 6 April 2014 – it is an event organised by BirdLife Australia to survey for Carnaby's Black Cockatoos and Forest Red-tailed Black Cockatoos at roost sites across the southwest of Western Australia. Angela Jakob from the City of Kwinana organised an information workshop on 22 March with Dr Hugh Finn who organises the event each year. Henry and Catherine were designated a roost site in nearby Banjup, unfortunately no cockatoos came to roost at the site. A large flock did pass over during the counting event (just after sunset – counting was from 5:30pm to 6:30pm). It would be great to have a site in Wandi and some interested residents take part in the count next year. If you have noticed black cockatoos come and roost in trees near where you live please drop the Wandi Landcare Group an email.

The Wandi Landcare Group and the City of Kwinana will be undertaking a community tree planting day on **Sunday 22 June 2014 from 9am to 12 noon** at Lake Magenup to continue the revegetation works. The site for this year's planting is pictured below. **Enter via Frayne Place** and park on the oval. Come on down and get amongst it - it's a great way to meet people, do something positive for the community and have some fun. There will be refreshments provided to keep energy up and a BBQ after all the hard work. Make sure you bring plenty of water and wear appropriate shoes! ## **WASTE TO ENERGY**

Committee members attended a presentation about a \$350 million waste plant set to be built in Kwinana which could convert up to 300,000 tonnes of rubbish into energy by 2016/7. The Kwinana Waste to Energy (WtE) plant being developed aims to turn non-recyclable waste into energy, with the by-product turned into bricks. The Kwinana plant will use the Martin Grate technology. Phoenix Energy's, managing director Peter Dyson said the facility, to be built on 3.5ha of land in the Kwinana industrial area, could turn 300,000 tonnes of waste into energy put back into the power grid per year. He said the plant could produce 60 megawatts of energy at full capacity which is enough energy to power 100,000 homes.

Mr Dyson said Australia created 44 million tonnes of solid waste between 2006 and 2007, half of which went into landfill. "No waste goes into landfill from this facility," he said. "The waste is turned into energy and the by-product, ash, is converted into bricks. About 20,000 bricks could be made each day." The plant will be designed to stringent EU Emissions standards for gaseous and aqueous emissions, using best available air pollution control technology. This new technology does not mean we should stop recycling. Recycling is a very important part of the waste hierarchy – avoid, reuse, reprocess, recycle, energy recovery and disposal. The WtE plant works on the premise that a lot of waste is diverted to be recycled and the plant takes that waste that would normally go to landfill.

This will be a first in Australia, however there are many in other parts of the world, including Japan, Europe, UK and US. Denmark, a leader in green energy, with a population of 5.5 million, has 29 WtE plants. In some more densely populated countries, where these WtE plants are built in suburban areas, they have created some interesting architecturally designed buildings – one even designed to look like a cathedral in Roskilde, Denmark.

As Perth gets bigger, the disposal of our rubbish becomes a larger and more pressing problem. Whilst most of us already reduce, recycle and reuse, there is still a massive amount of rubbish created both domestically and industrially on a daily basis. Landfill sites are being created many kilometres outside the metro area requiring garbage trucks to travel huge distances each day to dump the waste. It was certainly interesting to learn about this method of waste disposal and that City of Kwinana have committed to this project. Want to know more – check the internet.



*Warbler June 1994* – Twenty years ago the funding for the construction of the Wandí community hall was approved - \$155,000 from the Lotteries Commission and \$144,000 from Council.

*Warbler June 2004* – Ten years ago we were successful in gaining funding from the 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Western Australia Grants Scheme. We held a Foundation Day ceremony and morning tea at the hall including re-dedicating the flagpole donated by the old Hope Valley Primary School.
