## Mayor's Message

How quickly time flies and I find it amazing that we now find ourselves in 2014.

If I didn't get a chance to see you personally please accept a Merry Christmas, Happy Holidays, Seasons Greetings and Happy New Year from the City!

In the past 12 months we've had three different Prime Ministers and a federal election, a state election and a local government election. Nelson Mandela has sadly passed, and a royal baby has been welcomed into the world. The Dockers made the grand final for the first time ever and the US government scared the world as it shut down operations for several weeks.

So much to take in, and whether we like it or not, more changes are not far off, with local government reform in Perth easily the most talked about (and often most misunderstood) process currently taking place in our community.

There are far too many unknowns at the moment, in terms of local government reform, and at the time of writing we were mere weeks away from yet another major development (that being the release of proposed mergers by the Local Government Advisory Board). Due to this ever changing landscape, we can't provide much information via printed newsletters. Uncertain times are ahead, but as we've always done, the City of Kwinana will adopt a path which delivers the most benefits to our residents. At the time of writing my Mayor's message the City of Kwinana is taking a proactive approach and meeting with our South West Group neighbours so that we can have preliminary discussions with the LG Reform task ahead of us (Cockburn, Fremantle, East Fremantle and Melville) .

In other news, the new State Government Cat Laws are now in place. You should have now received a flyer in the mail outlining the changes, if not you can visit our website or call us on 9439 0200 to request a brochure be mailed out.

Bushfire season is now upon us and while the City of Kwinana impressively maintains a 99% compliance rate for firebreaks, it's absolutely essential that residents prepare their families and their homes for the threat of bushfires. Know your plan in advance and be ready to execute if the worst happens. Again, visit our website or give us a call for information.

On behalf of the City of Kwinana, I wish you and your family every success for 2014 and I look forward to being in attendance at your AGM in February.

### New Extension to Wandi South

Over the past three years, Honeywood has grown to become one of the most successful residential land developments in Perth's southern corridor. Following on from this success, Satterley Property Group has secured another 44 hectares of land, south of the group's existing Honeywood estate. The land, which is located off Lyon Road, will begin construction in early 2014. When complete, the master-planned community will have around 400 home sites and will include a primary and high school.

## Happenings at the Hall and Resource Centre

We've had a very busy time at the Wandi Community Centre, each permanent group has made use of the facilities for their Xmas break ups during the week or on weekends. The Woodturners held an evening function using the BBQ facilities, while the carvers had a sit down and share luncheon.

Even groups beyond the local community have made good use of the facilities for Xmas events, Bi Tone Caravan Club had a three day event that included camping on the edge of the oval and having a special family day where kid's games were played as part of the festivities. The Gypsy Rovers Touring Club also had a three day event that included their special Xmas club dinner and AGM. Events like this are very important to this type of club, as members get older and cannot participate in away events where towing a caravan can be too tiring as they can now participate locally, in safety. Catching up with other club members and being involved in club activities is good for body and mind.

It's disappointing to have the progress of the new building slowing and very frustrating when we know the use of such a facility is needed now and will only increase in the future. Clubs are marking time not knowing if they should be spending the cash they have or waiting and spending it on relocating in the new facility. The WPA is in the same position; should we upgrade some areas or wait and spend our funds on the new building. The building location is still in question, a compromise will be sought, let's hope its location will not cause any problems when entering and exiting. The major issue at the moment is that our preferred site is covered in spear wood and for environmental reasons this can't be cleared, seems a bit hypocritical when you see the clearing that has been done for residential off Lyon Road, our space is about 1,000 square meters.

Kwinana City Council is upgrading the oval for club sport use. It has always been a rural standard oval but, now that there is pressure from within and beyond the local community in such areas, Council will be spending more time on the upgrade of this important space. We have been in discussion with council

officers about its use, we want to maintain the activities of the organizations that use it for events other than sport that also need a grassed area for their events, e.g. medieval groups, caravan clubs, Donkey Society. I'm sure this can be done and everyone can have the benefit.

The WPA would like to thank all the permanent groups using the Wandi Community Centre for their continual support; each supports the other in a facility of this type. We also need to thank the City of Kwinana for their assistance; it takes a team effort to run this facility and each has a role to play.

## Wandi History

### Nuytsia floribunda (WA Christmas tree)

This is a rather non-descript tree until it produces blazing orange-gold flowers each summer. It is the largest parasitic plant in the world growing close to a host shrub but not killing it. The flowering of this tree was an indicator to the Aborigines of the south-west to return to the coast after spending the winter months at their inland hunting areas.



### Vale Dr Margaret Feilman (1921 – 2013)

With an oil refinery and other industrial projects being built on the coast, there was a need to house an influx of workers to the area. The State Housing Commission was instructed to commence building houses inland from the refinery site in the areas now known as Medina and Calista. The area was virgin bush and in 1952, at age 31, Dr Margaret Feilman was appointed by the State Government as Town Planner of the Kwinana project. Her legacy is still seen in Kwinana township today with the wide tree lined roads, many parks and large blocks of land, although the latter are now being subdivided.

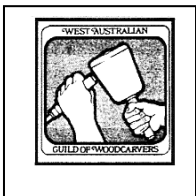

# Mandogalup Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade Reminds You:

Fire breaks should now be completed.

Firebreaks need to be cleared to bare earth 3 metres wide and have a 4 metre height clearance of all overhanging limbs and trees. This is to comply with City of Kwinana Firebreak regulations.

The compliance of the firebreak zone is very important as in the event of a bush fire one of the main fire vehicles used is a 9 tonne, 4 wheel drive truck which carries 3000 litres of water and requires clear access.

Driveways also need the above mentioned clearance. For safety reasons we cannot guarantee our volunteer firefighters will enter properties if there is a danger of them being trapped by not having clear access.

If you lock your gates or have automatic gates, you need to have alternative access for emergency vehicles. One option is to have a traditional gate (padlocked) into the firebreak in a position to allow the above mentioned fire and emergency vehicles to obtain access.

Maintain a 20m circle of security around your home, sheds, etc (clear or low ground vegetation)
